If JEO does not receive changes from you by Friday, May 20, we will assume that your jurisdiction has reviewed the plan and approves of it as written.

At this time, jurisdictions may also adopt the plan locally. Adoption would apply to the eventual FEMA-approved version of the plan. Attached is an example resolution that you may use or adapt to fit your local needs.

After local adoption and FEMA approval, your jurisdiction will become eligible for FEMA project grant funding to assist with implementation of actions in this plan. The adopted resolution must be returned to JEO Consulting Group for submittal to DHSEM and FEMA.
