Hazard Mitigation Plan

A Hazard Mitigation Plan is a communitydriven, living document that assesses vulnerability to natural and man-made hazards and identifies mitigation strategies to reduce vulnerability.



Hazards

Hazards include natural events which cause damage or pose risk to residents, the environment, buildings, and your local economy. Hazard types include flooding, wildfire, severe storms, and drought.



Mitigation

Mitigation is any action that reduces risk.
These actions depend on the specific needs of your community and existing capabilities. Examples of projects can include backup generators, storm shelters, alert sirens, flood control, and education programs.

this planning process.
