#### WORK ON TRIBAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN BEGINNING

Effort Being Led by the Northern Cheyenne Tribe

Northern Cheyenne Tribe – For every \$1 spent on hazard mitigation, \$6 in post storm cleanup and rebuilding is saved, according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Proactive hazard mitigation planning allows the Nation to take actions to reduce or eliminate threats from natural and manmade disasters. To help guide future hazard mitigation projects, the Northern Cheyenne Tribe is undertaking an effort to update their Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Hazard Mitigation Plans (HMP) are a requirement of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, administered by FEMA, and once the tribe updates and receives approval on the plan, they become eligible for grant cost-share opportunities which range from 75% coverage to over 90% coverage for a wide variety of projects listed in the plan. Hazard mitigation plans are required to be updated on a five-year cycle.

A hazard mitigation plan is a publicly-guided document that identifies vulnerability to natural disasters such as flood, drought, earthquake, wildfire, winter storm, etc. The plan sets goals, establishes mitigation alternatives, and prioritizes projects which may alleviate potential damages to property and provide protection when future disasters occur.

This planning effort is being guided by a Planning Team consisting of representatives from the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Council, tribal government positions, other tribal departments such as emergency management, Board of Health, and Utilities, as well as the public.

The public, which includes all residents of the reservation, tribal and non-tribal members, who do not hold a tribal government position, as well as all Northern Cheyenne Tribe members who reside off reservation, are encouraged to participate in the planning process.

The Northern Cheyenne Tribe has hired JEO Consulting Group, Inc. (JEO) to assist with the plan development over the next six months. This hazard mitigation plan update is funded by a FEMA planning grant. The cost is shared 75% through federal funding and 25% through a local match. For this plan update, the Tribe is providing the 25% local match through tracking labor and time spent on the planning process.



#### **Project Purpose**

The Northern Cheyenne Tribe of Montana is working with JEO Consulting Group to develop a Multi-Hazard Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP). HMPs are a community-driven document that evaluates local risk and vulnerabilities to a broad range of natural and human-caused hazards and identifies projects to reduce or mitigate this vulnerability. 




